



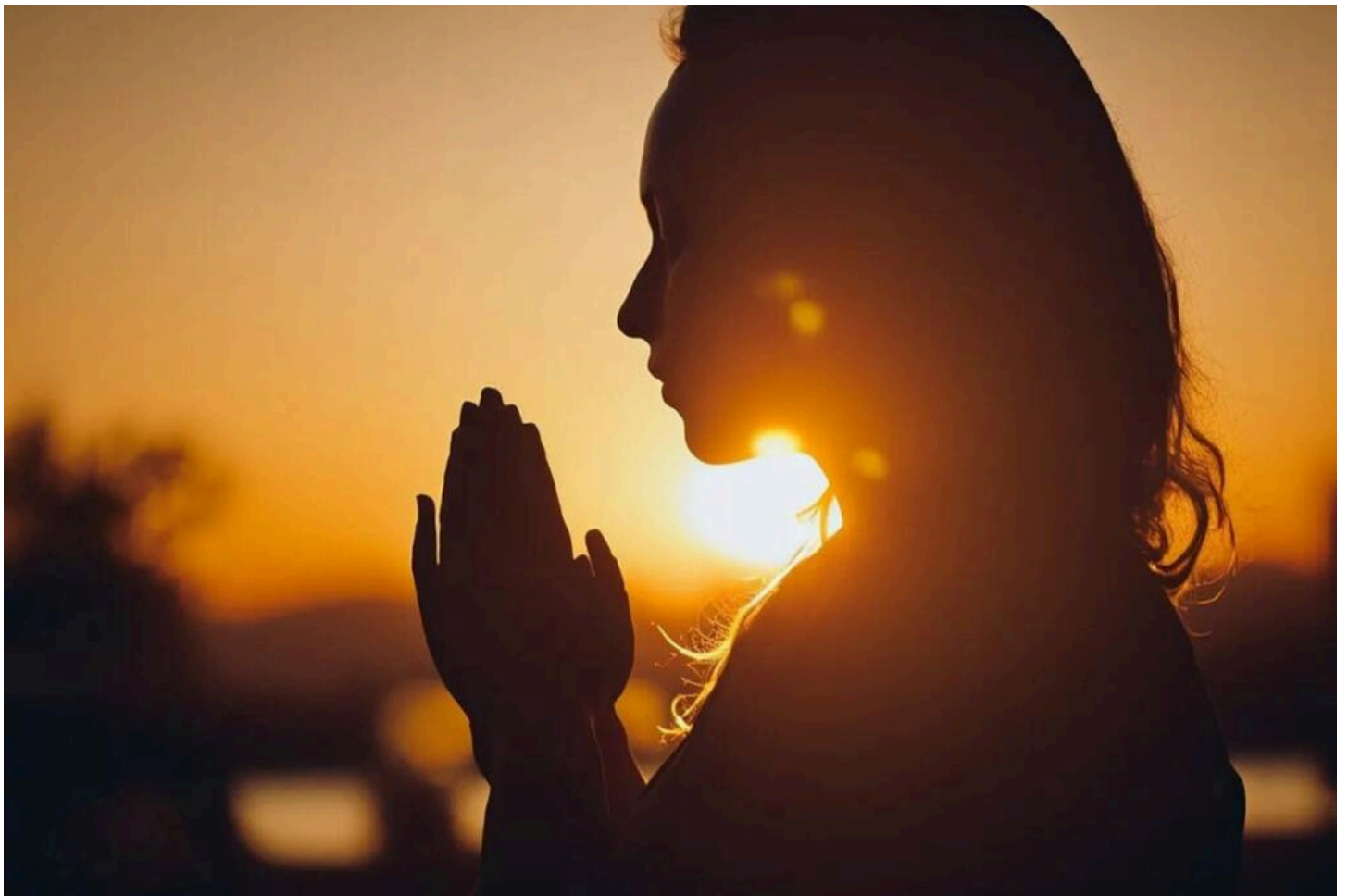
Steadfastness: A Cornerstone of Our Hope in Jesus

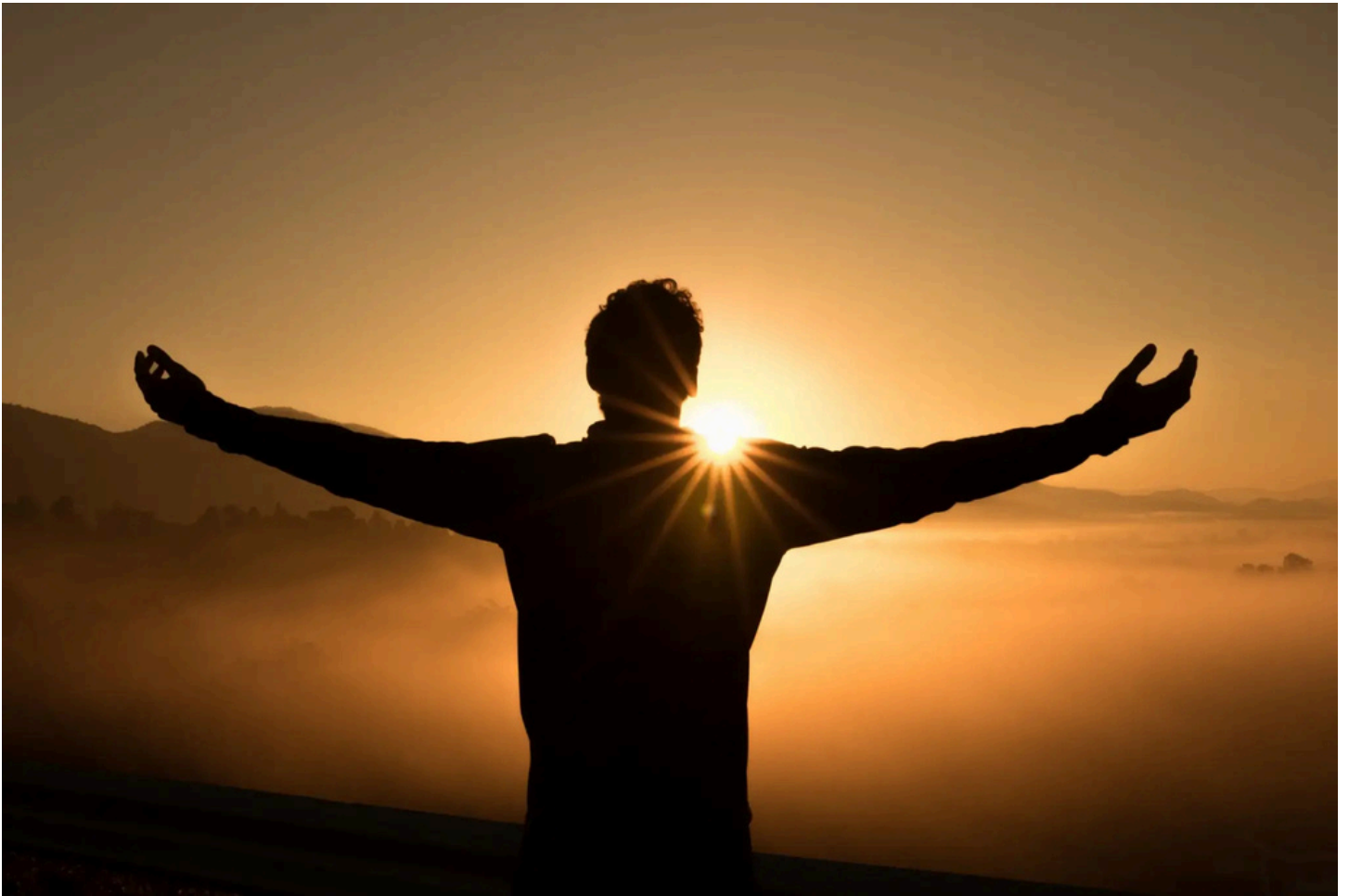


4. Jesus: Our Supreme Example of Steadfastness
