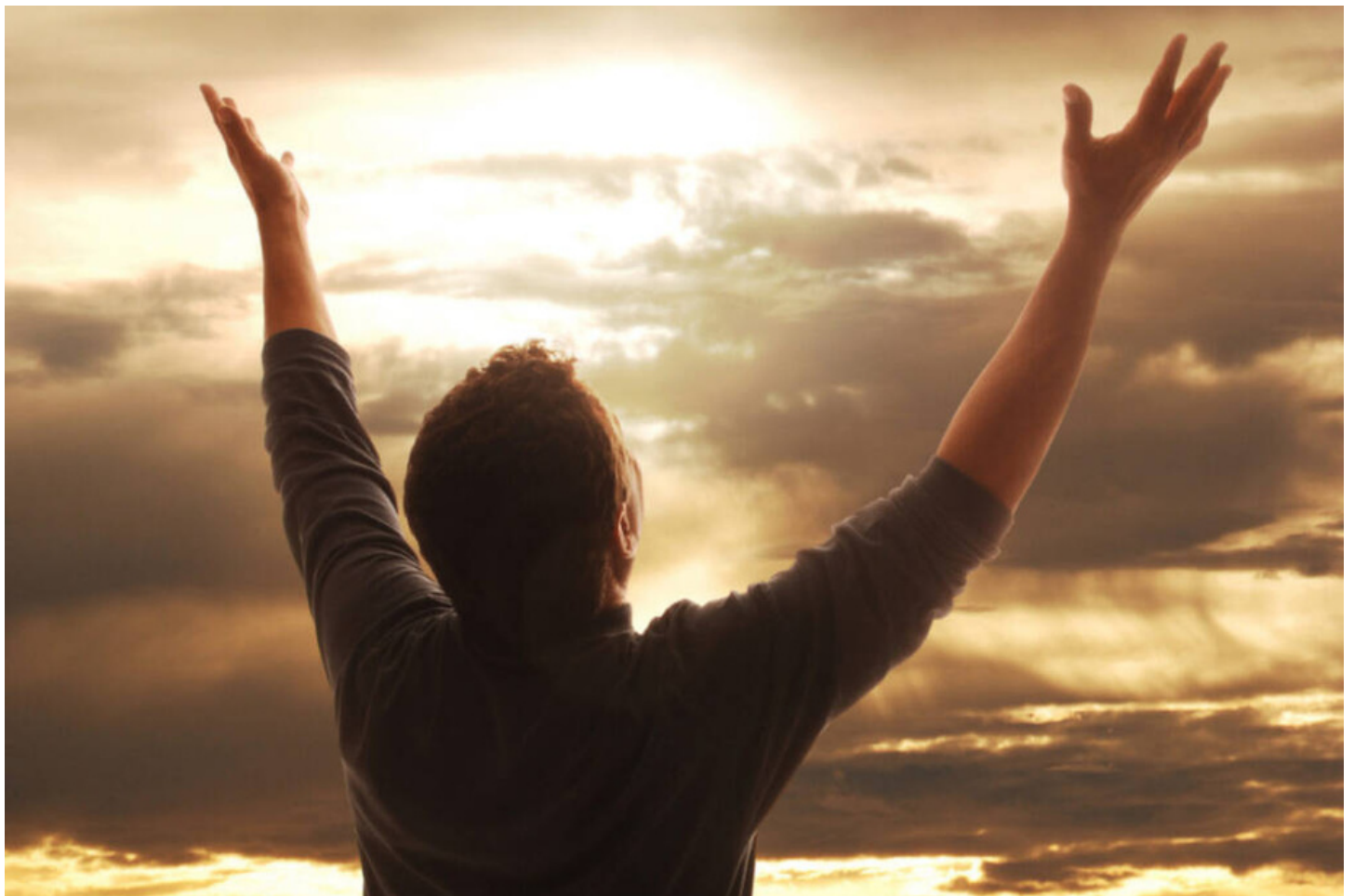




Worshipping Jesus: A Christian Perspective
